



Dear praying friends,

We continued visiting supporting churches and participated in two mission conferences in Florida, as well as visiting a new church in Indiana.



The highlight of the last month was a trip to Eastern Europe, where I was able to visit Ukraine and Poland. This time my trip to Ukraine was brief, where I could only purchase aid supplies and visit with the local church people. The demand for food supplies has been increasing, and we thank the Lord for the generosity of God's people toward this need. So, we purchased the non-perishable supplies and allocated them to five different churches across Ukraine.

As much as the Lord allows, we would love to visit all the churches, which have been dealing with those in need that live in their community. The pastors have been using these packages specifically toward the goal of proclaiming the truth of the Gospel and their positive responses have been an encouragement to us.





Just prior to flying to Europe, Lena came down with an infection, which grew into pneumonia with a high fever for several days, and she ended up in a hospital. We were planning to meet in Poland after I visited Ukraine. Therefore, we had to change the plans, and I became the lone participant in our survey trip to Gdansk, Poland, which sits on the shore of the Baltic Sea. We owe a special debt of gratitude to our sending church in Kansas City, our home church in Florida, and to the staff at BWM for their great help and many prayers as we navigated through some rough waters.

Somehow, Gdansk, Poland, became a home for a large number of refugees from Ukraine but also from Belarus and Russia. So, the Russian and Ukrainian speech could be heard almost everywhere I went. I spoke at a local Baptist

church that consists primarily of Ukrainians and some Belarusians, and it was a blessing to see how much they desire to reach out to their countrymen with the Gospel.



I also visited different Bible study groups throughout the week. For the mid-week service, I went to a suburb of Gdansk, where the local Ukrainians are meeting for a Bible study and English lessons. A pastor from Gdansk shared his burden to start a local church in that place and a few other locations, but they simply don't have anyone willing to commit to this task. We thank the Lord for the vision and the burden He placed in this pastor's heart and are in prayer for what the Lord has in store for our family.



In total, I stayed for two Sundays, and we had a great Easter service. My path then continued to Yerevan, Armenia, where I've been visiting with my dad, whose health is in decline. Last month he was struggling with breathing, was

admitted to a hospital, and now is at home. The strong medications he had taken at the hospital have been having an adverse effect on his cognitive and mental abilities. So, please pray for clarity and the ability to understand the truth of the Gospel so that he may see how this truth pertains to him personally.



We want to extend our gratitude to each one of you for your faithful prayers and generous hearts!

The Lord has been meeting the need to supply funds for the Ukraine relief/evangelism program.
