They missed this last Sunday and when someone called to check on her, she told them that her mother had been left for dead by the side of the road by a hit-and-run accident. Her mother lives in Syria, and her sister is taking care of her, but she was terribly upset. This family does not know the Lord and is from an Orthodox background.

As time seems to be getting shorter and shorter until the Lord’s return, we thank God for the opportunity to be able to serve him here in this needy land. Pray that we trust God for our health and pray that the government will keep its hands off the church both here and in America. We appreciate all your prayers for us and your support.
